What is wildlife conservation?

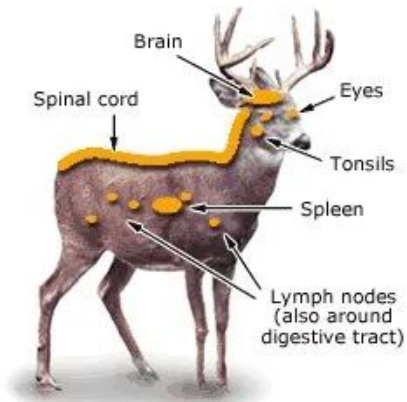
- Protecting animal species and their habitats.

What are some Problems?

1. **Habitat loss**

- a. Humans building homes and roads on top of habitats

2. **Invasive species**

- a. Non-native species causing environmental or economic damage

3. **Overuse**

- a. Overfishing, over hunting, or over harvesting animals to make goods

4. **Disease**

- a. When animals get sick

5. **Pollution**

- a. Result of humans making goods and using goods with things like factories

6. **Changing weather**

- a. Result of many factors, but humans play a part in the changing weather
