## SWAN STUDY PUBLIC COMMENT GENERAL INFORMATION:


- 1384 total comments at closing on 8/31/2017.
- 423 of these comments were from Lake County Residents.
- 111 comments were from Swan Valley Residents (47 opinions/comments were from Lake County Swan Valley residents and 64 were from non-Lake County Swan Valley residents).

## **MEETING RESULTS FROM 9/14/2017:**

The Lake County Conservation District (LCCD) met on Thursday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, to decide if the idea of establishing a 60,000 acre Conservation Forest on federal lands, in the Swan Valley, in Lake County should be pursued or dropped. The public comment period ended on August 31. We received 1384 opinions/comments, of which 80% of these opinions opposed the concept. Lake County residents submitted 423 of the opinions/comments—54% of which supported the concept. Swan Valley residents submitted 111 opinions/comments—85% of which opposed the concept.

After considerable deliberation, the LCCD voted 4 to 2 in favor of continuing to work on the concept. (Sigurd Jensen, Zoe Lilja, Carlos Rodriques and Jim Simpson in favor of continuation; Curt Rosman and Susan Gardner were opposed; and voting member Mark McGuyer was absent). The next step is to contact members of our congressional delegation, explain the concept of a Conservation Forest, and identify the path forward at the federal level.
