3. SB-310 PERMITTING: Follow up site visit Report by Allen

Due to privacy concerns and data security, LCCD has not uploaded 310 permit information to the State website. It's been several years since this was considered. Should revisit.

<u>Cotton Property</u>: 310 permit (now expired) approved bridge construction, but the approach and fill has never been completed. The approach is made of creosote railroad ties that will be covered by high water and may leach into the Swan River and tributary. Landowner will be contacted and a formal site visit planned to determine future plans to address current situation.

<u>Johnson Creek/Kootenai Estates (Evans)</u>: All complete and looks good.

<u>Hubbard/Kasser Creek</u>: Recently extended permit included completion of thinning. Instead, almost all vegetation (excluding grass) has been cleared. Currently using it as a horse pasture. The original permit included plans for creek crossings. Currently, crossings are made of logs haphazardly placed across creek. Current condition does not reflect plans described in permit.

Landowner will be contacted via mail requesting an onsite review and discussion of plans to bring into compliance.

<u>Rainbow Drive</u>: Overall—great job. Much of the vegetation survived, but not all on the bank. Consider a site visit in the spring to see how high the water comes up the bank to determine if a recommendation for re-seeding is appropriate.

Ludwig/Grassy Creek: Permitted culvert looks good and is working well.

<u>Potential Violation</u>: No permit was issued for a major new single residential construction right on Swan River. Allen will complete a Complaint form and submit to LCCD office. Once received, a notice of complaint will be sent to the landowner.

<u>VanRy-Cilly Creek</u>: 310 permit included construction of a bridge, which is complete. It appears that the owner didn't build the permitted new bridge wide enough, so still using the old road which is (find permit and look at letter).

This exercise has proven that sending a completion form to the owner and relying on self-reporting without an onsite review by LCCD is not working well. LCCD will be setting up a schedule for follow ups and revising/revisiting 310 procedures and record-keeping.
